Bergen, Norway

Day 1

Bergen is a city on Norway's southwestern coast. It's surrounded by mountains and fjords, including Sognefjord, the country's longest and deepest. Bryggen features colorful wooden houses on the old wharf, once a centre of the Hanseatic League's trading empire. This is now home to many of the city's restaurants, pubs, craft shops and historical museums. Take the Fløibanen Funicular up Fløyen Mountain for panoramic views and hiking trails. The Edvard Grieg House is where the renowned composer once lived.





Hardangerfjord, Norway

Day 2, 3 & 4 Rosendal & Lofthus

Hardangerfjord is the second longest fjord in Norway.

The nature and the heritage in the region forms the perfect backdrop for a wide range of activities and adventures. An epic sight is the Troll's Tongue or Trolltunga, a slender spur of rock projecting in to the void above Lake Ringedalsvatnet, however it is a tough hike of 23km from the trailhead at Skjeggedal, and only recommended for those in good physical shape.

A great fjord-side diner is Gloyp, which offers fresh, well executed food in a light, bright space.





Sognefjord, Norway

Day 5, 6 & 7 Gulen, Gudvangen, Flam, Skjolden

The greatest attraction of the Sognefjord is its immense variety of landforms gathered in one and the same region, from wide-open fjord landscapes and green hills to narrow fjord arms, massive mountain ranges and spectacular blue glaciers.

In the summer you can enjoy an exciting guided glacier tour to Nigardsbreen, which is suitable for most people, including children as young as 6 years old, and is not particularly demanding. You will of course need some warm clothes.

All the way along Sognefjord are small, picturesque villages.
